
3. Eat your vegetables if you want to be strong






The recipe for a successful road trip lies in the following & a trusty vehicle, great company and an adventurous mindset! Yes, it is that simple.




fall. Texas is big and brash.





## WHAT TO STUDY


#### ART, DESIGN, MEDIA

Its alumni include Donna Karen and Mare Jacobs.

- Puerto Rican Day Parade. New York hosts the country's biggest Latino event every year in June, with BBQs, concerts, celebrities and salsa for miles in every direction.
- Lady Liberty. Go up to the observation deck in the crown for one of the best views of the city and Ellis Island.
- After hours in the Village. The bohemian heart of Manhattan, Greenwich is where coffee houses, live music, avant-garde theatre, intellectuals and students all mix.



#### MUST DO'S

- Try Rocky Mountain Oysters. If you like fishballs, you've gotta try sheep balls. These are really made from the thing that hangs between a male sheep's legs. If you're grossed out, you can try bison steak.
- Fly Fishing. You'll need waders, flies, at least a 6-pack of beer, supreme bladder control and the ability to match wits with trout in lakes and rivers.
- Chinatown. Denver's big Asian community holds dragon boat races and parades every year for CNY, so you're never too far from the comforts of Chua Chu Kang or Kallang.
- Learn to Ski/Snowboard. Learning to ski or snowboard is a virtual must. If there's been a fresh dusting of powder the night before, most of your classmates will head for the hills, so don't be a huge loser and be the only one who's clueless


## WHAT TO STUDY

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





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#### 1. Broadway Basics

For over 250 years. Broadway has hosted an array of performances from plays to comedies to operas. Performances were considered "Broadway" if they were located in the theatre district of New York City or the West End of London, had big budgets, over the top sets. and well-known actors and producers. In short, it's not your local school production or some community centre Chinese opera. If a performance is lucky enough to have a lot of money or a big producer backing it. then it may be debuted on Broadway. However, some start out at smaller theatres and work their way up. Not to worry: if you won't be in NYC or London anytime soon, some Broaduay companies have travelling groups performing all over the world. Here are some Broadway basics for you. so that you don't end up being a Broadway Beng.



#### 2. Broad -en Your Vocabulary

In order not to speak like a blockhead of Broadway. you'll need to throw in some theatre terms here and there (like the ones below) to keep you at the centre stage of any conversation.

PLAYBILL: The free program or guide handed out at the performance: it lists the characters, actor and actress bios, scene guides, etc.

BROADWAY: Theatre with 500 seats or more located within the New York City Theatre District

OFF-BROADWAY: Theatre with 99-499 seats where actors have equity contracts (which provide job security, minimum salaries, etc)

FRINGE THEATRE: Theatrical performances outside of the West End in London (comparable to Off-Broadway)

CURTAIN CALL: After a performance, actors come back on stage to receive the applause of the

GREEN ROOM: A room close to the stage for actors to relax and touch-up their makeup.

HOUSE: The audience

RUN: When a production performs a sequence of shows




#### 7. Get Your Act Together

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#### MAKINGS OF A LADY BOY

Charyl, 52, knew she was a female from birth. She would stand in the shower and examine her figure thinking something was very wrong. She didn't belong in that body. She was a woman, but her physique resembled a man Women were nothing more than friends to her, but men on the other hand, made her blumb.

In some cases, one reason males from countries like Thailand go through a sex change is because they were raised to believe they weren't boys at all Some parents (mostly the mothers) believe a female will take care of their family better than a male. Many times, the last child is the one held most responsible for the family. Thus, the youngest is raised as a girl regardless of true gender. If born a male, the boy may over time begin to feel as if he is truly female because of the way he was brought up. They are put into traditional female roles, are regarded as women and concequentially, exude a feminine aura, once they reach an age where they are believed to have the ability to care for themselves and the family, the teens take over That includes the financial responsibilities. This is often necessary because Thailand doesn't have a well-established welfare system.

In Thailand, there aren't heaps of ways to make a decent living, especially for teenagers Thus, they are left with few options; manual labour on a farm, hawking goods at a market, or possibly, selling themselves. As you can imagine, the final option is the most lucrative. For instance, working on a chicken farm for about a week would carn you 2,000 Baht or \$\$\$5.5 However, as a call girl, a young woman can earn many times more in just one night.

#### THE TRANSFORMATION

Make-up, perfume, nail polish, clothes, and hair are the fun parts of being a woman. The most difficult part of the transition is all of the surgeries Trying to match how they feel on the inside with what is portrayed on the outside often takes numerous painful operations and ultimately that's the key to being a successful transsexual prostitute.

Charyl, with silky, highlighted hair and a pretty face, had her first surgery seven years ago. She paid 3\$4,000 for breasts. Next, she had her penis removed and the area reconstructed into female genitalia for S\$5,000 But she didn't stop there She also got her adam's apple chiselled and her nose reconstructed to give them a more feminine appearance. To top it all off, she had laser hair removal under her arms. Charyl paid for the surgeries entirely by herself. She worked as a masseuse for many years before saving enough money for her first surgery. All of the operations were performed in Thailand with a doctor who, not surprisingly, has had lots of experience in this area.

Not all lady boys go through as much extensive surgery though. Karen, who came from Vietnam, is very unlike Charyl. She's skinny. but appears to not have had as many operations. Karen has a wide, masculine nose and prominent adam's apple. Her broad shoulders and clearly fake black wig make her look like a fruity beer amongst colourful cocktails She tries to exude femininity by brushing her cheeks with a rosy pink colour and applying silver shimmer powder on the insides of her eyes with a darker eye shadow on the corners But behind the make up and fake hair, is undeniably a man.

#### MOTIVATIONS

Post-operation, many lady boys travel to places like Phuket and Singapore to work because there are a lot of business opportunities. For most of them the money is used to support their families back home. Peasons include paying for a parent's hospital bills, to funding a siblings education so he wouldn't be subjected to this type of work as well.

Karen travelled from Vietnam to Singapore for related reasons. Her mother is in the hospital and needs money for treatments. She hopes to make enough cash to take care of her sick parent. Clara, 30, had a similar story. Back home in Bangkok, her father has cancer. In an effort to raise money to pay his hospital bills, Clara came to Singapore to work in the industry. And then there's Charyl who entered this line of work to help her older brother go to school She felt that with an education her brother wouldn't have to follow in her footsteps.

To Charyl its worth it The money she earms here in Singapore helps support her family in Chiang Mai and that makes her happy. Her relatives do not know the true source of her income though. They believe she is working here as a karaoke girl Although they know of her sexuality and transformation, they would disapprove of her being a prostitute and she can't bear the thought of disappointing her family.

Charyl's current boyfriend, as she calls him, is from Australia. His grey speckled beard and balding head unintentionally disclose his old age. He was married twice before and even had grandchildren. but now that he is divorced he feels free to do as he wishes. At the going rate of SSEO per day. Charyl has stuck by his side for 5 days in a row. Could this holiday 'fling" last beyond the first week? Charyl coyly unveiled that while visiting Singapore, her Australian boyfriend tattoped her real That name on the back of his neck. He knows about her transformation. and he's okay with that. When he told her he loved her Charyl was happy, but apprehensive. She likes him, but doesn't love him Not surprisingly, she believes actions speak louder than words. Only if he decides to go to Thailand to seet her family or he invites her to Australia to meet his, will she consider dropping the "L" word.

#### FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH

The price scale to spend time with working ladies like Charyl or Karen differs depending on the clients' ethnicity and length of time spent with them. For Asiana, a "short time" costs around S\$150. A "long time" runs approximately S\$250. For Western clients, the price is a bit steeper. A "short time" begins at about \$\$20 and a "long. time" is closer to 8\$350. In comparison to working on a chicken farm in Thailand, it could take a month of manual labour to earn as much as they could in one night or a few days as a lady boy prostitute. During a slow week, Charyl takes in about \$\$1,000. On the other hand, when business is good, about 3\$2,500 is what she would expect to get for only a week's worth of working.

Sometimes Charyl's clients also try to buy her jewellery, but she tries to persuade them not to She worries it will be ripped off and stolen while she works in the bars and clubs. The issue doesn't seem to bother Karen though, who wears big silver earrings while she's working.

As you can imagine, it's not easy for them to work in places like Singapore. When your passport says you are a male, but in person sauntered into the bar, lady boys you look like a woman customs officials more than likely stop you at the border. They either send you back or give you a hard time

entering the country. Many lady boys come to Singapore on a visitor's pass. Thus, every couple of months they have to leave and then go through the whole process of trying to re-enter again. This. like so many other parts of their life, is a constant struggle.

Once in Singapore, some rent a hotel with friends while others stay in a house or an apartment with a "boss" For the latter option. lady boys only pay about 8330 a night, but the real cost is their freedom. They are told where to work plus the boss will often sit in a dark corner of the bar keeping a watchful eye to ensure they are always pursing clients. That was the case with Anabelle. 24, who was hesitant to talk to anyone without first being bought a cocktail. In this particular bar, lady boys receive a SS4 commission for every drink you buy them. For the cost of her S\$22 cocktail and a S\$34 glass of wine for her friend, the two were able to sit and chat for a few minutes. At least that was the case until a tall, dark, and "almost" handsome man in a black suit penetrated the velvet curtain blocking the entrance. When he flocked to him, including Anabelle. They all competed for his business. Although the freshly ordered drinks weren't finished, the conversation obviously was.




The "female athlete triad" is a specific medical condition affecting women participating in a wide variety of sports. Usually it involves them training at an extremely intensive level, and results in 3 main problems (hence the term, "triad"):

- 1. An energy imbalance issue (or eating issue)
- 2. Irregular menses or periods that stop altogether
- Osteoporosis (thinning and weakening of the bones)

The main cause of the "triad" is likely to be an "energy imbalance", or "input-output mismatch" issue. In other words, the athlete is burning much more calories than she is consuming. Or possibly, she is dieting inappropriately, resulting in reduced caloric intake that is unable to match her daily requirements.

For example, a recent patient of mine started to train for an upcoming ultra-endurance event. She was normally jogging about 20 km per week. She followed a gradual program of increasing distance, and at the time she saw me she was doing more than 50 km each week. On a daily basis she was probably burning over 5,000 calories a day (normal about 2,500 calories), but she wasn't eating enough calories to replace what she was using! Her reaction was - "to get 5,000 calories I'll have to eat like a pig, and I want to diet to build muscle and not gain fat!"

The problem with this input-output mismatch is that it ends up messing up the other finely tuned hormone systems in the body. especially the female menstrual cycle, and also bone metabolisr



However, it is the regular menstrual periods which have a preserving and protective effect on our bone mass, which is why osteoporosis (bone weakening/thinning) usually only affects women after menopause. However, in female athletes who have had the "triad" and absent menses for a long time, these very physically strong and well-trained women may actually have the thin osteoporotic bones of a 60 year old. This in turn increases the risk of developing problems of weak bones, such as stress That's fractures.

> The main area of prevention as well as treatment is to address the primary problem of the athletes' nutrition and input-output status. Often we might refer these women to sports nutritionists, who can do a detailed analysis of how many calories they are burning daily, and develop a dietary plan that can appropriately match and replenish the calories lost.

Most of the time, the nutritional interventions help to sort out the female cycle after a few months. Sometimes, in the interim, the gynaecologist may prescribe an oral contraceptive pill, to try to get the athlete to start having "regular periods" until their own bodies systems normalize.

Hopefully, with the appropriate prevention, these athletes never get too osteoporotic or "bone thinned". In some cases however, calcium supplements and even special medications may be required to treat the osteoporosis.

## Ligament injuries in women

The anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) is probably the most important ligament in our knees - the one that keeps our knees stable to allow us to perform cutting sports like badminton, netball, basketball, volleyball, etc. It is the most common ligament injury to require surgery in the form of ACL reconstruction.

Women have a two to eight times higher risk of getting an ACL tear. In fact, in the USA, where the absolute number of female athletes participating in high school and collegiate sports is similar to males, the percentage of female patients undergoing ACL reconstruction is higher than males!


There are many theories as to why women have a higher ACL tear risk. Numerous causes have been proposed, but to date none have been conclusively proven to increase the risk of ACL tears. These possible causes include:-

- \* Women seem to have more joint laxity than men
- \* Effects of the hormonal cycle on the elasticity of ligaments
- \* Size of the space where the ACL sits in the knee (the so-called "narrow notch")
- \* Smaller ACL ligaments than men

Recently one of the possible reasons that has gained popularity is the way that girls naturally land after a jump. Video analysis has been conducted on these differences. When viewed from the front, boys land with their knees the same distance apart as their feet and their shoulders. Girls on the other hand naturally go into a "knock-kneed" stance, in which the knees tend to come together as they land. This "valgus landing position" has been suggested to be a strong risk factor for getting ACL tears.

There are currently studies ongoing in the USA looking at the possible effect of pre-season "jump-landing" training for female soccer and basketball teams, to see if this training can reduce the risk of ACL injury in women. So far, interim data seem promising.



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After speaking with a number of katoeya it's apparent they go through the transformation for two main reasons one, because lady boys truly believe they are women. Two, because if they are women, being beautiful prostitutes is how they will make the most money. Noticeably, their family's well-being is their number one priority. Family almost always comes up in conversation, even at the most unscrupulous establishments. There is more often than not, a sibling a parent, or a relative, that needs medical care, but they simply can't afford it. To some, prostitution is the answer. I found the drastic measures these women have taken to care for their families overwhelming and difficult to understand. With the struggle to clearly define what is right and wrong, what is considered going too far to protect your family? Put yourself in their shoes. What would you do if your sibling felt they had to work as a lady boy to care for a diseased parent? This gives us all something to ponder - the things we are willing to give up or change to feel complete and care for someone else. The next time you see a transsexual, before you condemn them for being who they are, take a second and think - if the tables were turned, what would be your story?



A FLEA MARKET FLEA-TURE



FLEA MARKETS - land of the quirky and the eclectic, a shopping experience promising a quick jaunt off the beaten track, into a bewildering array of second hand items guaranteed to captivate and intrigue. Having spent the better part of my teenage years exploring the quirks and foibles of flea markets across the island, I set out to discover just how open shoppers were to a little dose of the uncanny.

It was to be a social experiment of sorts - I would revive the fad of pet rocks, hugely popular in the 80s, and try hawking them to unsuspecting Singaporeans.

Part of the attraction of flea markets, I believed, was the notion of unpredictability, the departure from the organised, sanitised mall experience, where racks of clothes were colour-coded and then arranged by size, and store offerings hardly differed in their valiant attempts to stay in the fickle loop of fashion.

My pet rocks, I hoped, which came complete with name tags and gender-specific descriptions, would appeal to the slightly off-kilter crowd, those saddled with the same ennui I had experienced with shopping malls all those years ago when I first delved into flea markets.

Armed with a red and white checkered tablecloth, some signage, a bag full of rocks and pockets brimming with zest, I arrived bright and early at The Mega Flea Market, Singapore's largest flea market to date, held at the Singapore Expo in late January.

The general sentiment, however, as I soon realised, was that most people just didn't want an inanimate object as a pet, and while most conceded that it was a 'cute concept' and a 'novel idea', it was impossible to convince anyone to take home a little pet rock.

Others seemed vaguely interested, but ultimately decided that keeping a rock as a pet was too esoteric a concept for them to stomach. A lovely middle aged lady laughed off my persuasions to purchase a rock, saying she had 'not come to the stage' where she could 'appreciate such a thing'.



Surrounded by stalls featuring imported apparel and cosmetics packaged in neat boxes, my dearth of sales continued well into the late afternoon, as I was faced with polite, but disinclined audiences. Perplexed expressions and confounded faces seemed the order of the day, while some looked visibly uncomfortable and shied away when I gaily chirped a welcome to my

Just as my enthusiasm was about to peter out, a couple approached. Tentative at first, their hesitation was soon replaced by a buoyant ebullience as they jubilantly picked out a pet rock - a slightly misshapen, angular, pale rock named Megan to call their own.

An (just a note: that's the girl's name), effusive about her new friend, described the idea of pet rocks as 'awesome', and affirmed her preference for the inanimate because 'everybody is crazy about real things, but I think we should invest in non-living things as well' while her partner Ruddin described the rocks as 'visually unique'.

Clearly charmed by their new critter, An exuberantly declared that she would bring Megan out and even talk to her.

While that was to be my first and last sale of the day, it reinforced the belief I had when I first set out on this experiment.

As a society, we aren't a particularly unconventional lot. We stick to practiced norms, and prefer to hold the bizarre and peculiar at arms length, ascertaining their characteristics solidly before allowing it into the confines of our comfortable existence. We might fear the unfamiliar, or regard it with initial suspicion.


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

- Do Bargain. Vendors are usually folks selling their old stuff to free up space around the house, and most don't mind knocking off a few dollars if you ask nicely and pick up an additional item or two. A bright smile never hurts!

#### AMELIA EARHART

In the 1930s, aviator Amelia Earhart set records for solo flights, fastest flights, first crossings and longest non-stop flights everywhere from Mexico to Hawaii, crisscrossing impossible distances over open ocean - which was considered death-defying in those days. She disappeared somewhere near Kiribati, as she attempted to become the first person to circumnavigate the world by plane. Mainly due to her, the US airforce later enrolled more than 1,000 female pilots.



#### MARIE CURIE

She was not only the first woman to win a Nobel prize, but she became the first person to ever win 2 Nobel prizes, amazingly in 2 different disciplines - chemistry and physics. She discovered numerous elements including radium, and pioneered our understanding of radioactivity (without which things like nuclear energy wouldn't exist) and portable radiation units (used to treat wounded soldiers) Ultimately, her devotion led to her death due to excessive exposure to radiation.

#### MADONNA

Ever since Madonna began her pop career in the 80s, her popularity hasn't diminished even after 2 decades. The queen of pop's Hard Candy album tour was the top-grossing international tour in 2008, bringing in US\$280 million in revenue. In 2009's list of top earning musicians, the 50-year old Material Girl showed no sign of stopping, as she heads the list with US\$110 million. followed by Celine Dion and Beyonce Knowles.



This self-made billionaire is one of the most powerful personalities in the media industry, who's earned a whopping US\$275 million just last year, making her the highest-earning celebrity. Thanks to her Harpo production company, her satellite radio contract and her magazine, Oprah's earning power still remains resilient despite the fact that her flagship chat show the Oprah Winfrey Show - continues to erode.

While the internet is killing our thirst for printed matter, some authors manage to bank huge earnings: US\$563 million just last year collectively. No surprise who took the bulk of it – JK Rowling (creator of Harry Potter) cashed in a whopping US\$300 million all by herself. #### KATIE, AGE 21




